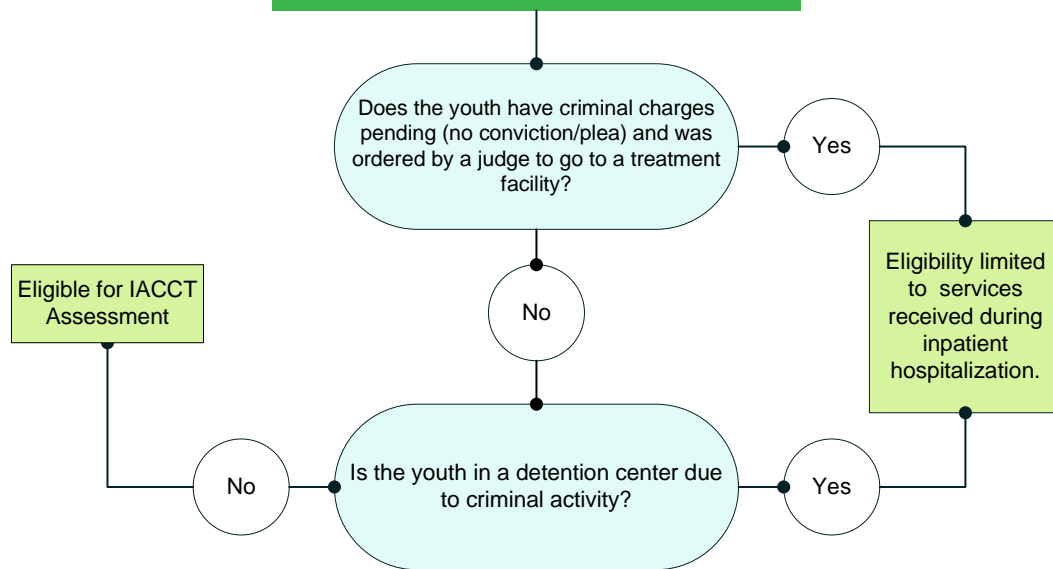
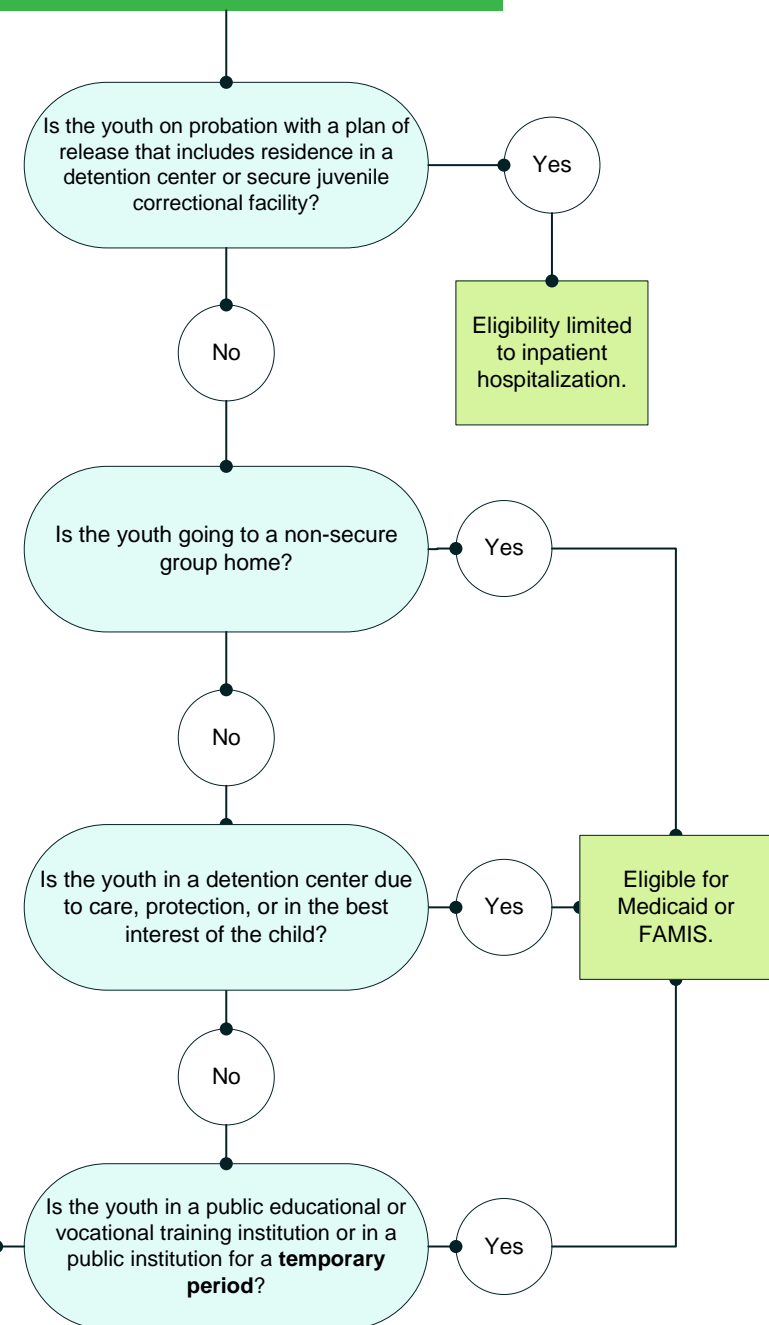

VA DMAS – IACCT Workflow Youth in Detention Eligibility

Updated: March 2025

Items to Note:

Youth who are in detention (or incarcerated) **cannot** be emergency placed into a TGH or PRTF without an IACCT being completed. The youth still needs a court order or treatment order to go through the residential process.

Foster Care youth who are in detention (or incarcerated) **cannot** be emergency placed **directly** into a TGH or PRTF.

Foster Care youth who are **released** from detention to **DSS Custody** can be emergency placed into a TGH or PRTF without an IACCT being completed.

Definitions:

- **Court Disposition:** a final determination on a criminal charge that can mark the case as resolved. Issued by a judge after the defendant has been sentenced.
- **Temporary Period:** Individuals in public institutions for a temporary period include those admitted under TDO, those arrested and admitted to a medical facility, inmates out on bail, or those on parole, probation, or conditional release.
